Playtime

Needed Materials

Blocks, animals, or any toy that varies in size

How To Play

Get out a box of toys such as blocks. Make sure the toys vary in size. How you play will depend on the language level of your child. There are 3 different variations below.

Variations For Language Practice

1. **Receptive language task (listening).** Show your child 2 different blocks that vary in size. Ask your child to grab the little or the big block. Ask in random order "big" and "little" so your child learns the concepts instead of a pattern.
2. **Expressive language task.** Have your child be in charge and tell you which block to choose, big or little, while building with blocks. This will give your child an opportunity to practice saying the words as well.
3. **Combination of both expressive and receptive language tasks.** Organize all the blocks into 2 piles. One pile is for the big blocks and the other pile is for the little blocks. Make sure to talk about the concepts as you decide with your child where each block goes.
