Not That One!

Needed Materials

Toys with multiple pieces

How To Play

Tell your child that you are going to play a fun game of choices! He/she is going to learn a new way of asking for toys. Place two toys on a table. Ask your child which one he/she wants by saying which one he/she doesn't want. At first, you may have to model the desired response many times. This may be a brand new skill.

For example, place a toy strawberry and a toy hamburger on the table. Let's say the child points to a strawberry. The parent says, "not hamburger." The parent knocks the hamburger off the table in a silly way and gives the child a strawberry.

Once your child seems to understand the game, start encouraging your child to say "not_____."

Tips

- Don't turn this game into a quiz or a stressful environment for your child by pressuring him/her to repeat too much or by over-correcting
- While playing, say "no" and "not" lots. With many verbal models, you will accelerate the learning process.
- Keep it natural!
